

Daley Ranch



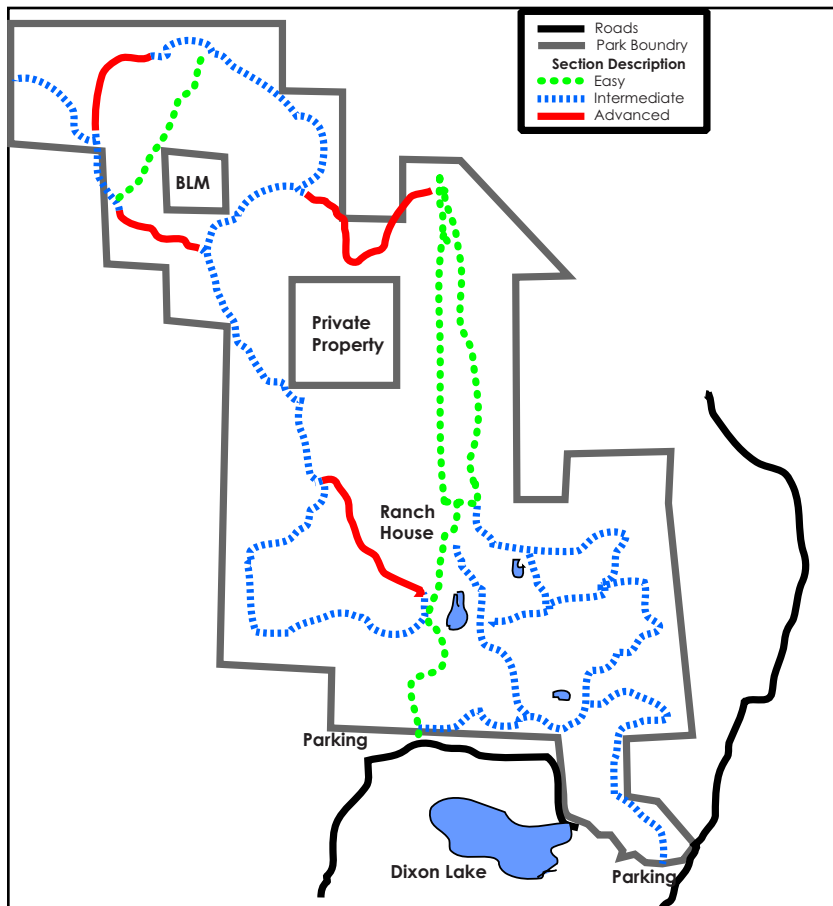
Directions to the Park

To get to Daley Ranch, take I-15 to El Norte Parkway. (Look for the signs to Dixon Lake, which shares the same entrance area as the ranch.) Head east on El Norte Parkway for 4 miles to La Honda Dr. Turn left on La Honda Dr. La Honda Dr. dead-ends at the entrance to Daley Ranch. Park in the parking lot on the left hand side of the street, as Dixon Lake charges for entrance on the weekends.

Best Route:

The best route to get a full dose of Daley Ranch starts with the Chaparral Trail. From the parking lot, cross the gate, and take the first trail. You might as well grab a map while you are there. Follow the Chaparral trail past where it joins the Ranch House trail. Go left and loop around the pond. After you have climbed awhile, look for a single track to take off from the left side of the road and go down a valley. When the single track forks, go right. When you get back to the Chaparral Trail, take a left and go down the hill. At the bottom of the hill turn left and go past the ranch house. Follow the road until you see the lake. On the right side you will come to the Central Valley trail. Follow this trail about 5 miles until it meets the Englemann Oaks Trail, turn right. After you go through the grove, watch for a singletrack to the left.

This will cut off a section of the Englemann Oaks Trail. After you are back on the trail watch for another trail to leave to the left. This is the alternate route for the Englemann Oaks trail and should definitely be followed. At the bottom take a left and head up the grinder hill. Take a left again at the Englemann Oaks turn. This time don't take the singletrack, but go down the Central Valley Trail. At the bottom take a left and follow the Jack Creek Meadow trail to the Ranch House. Chose your return route from here. This is a strenuous route. Take plenty of water.
